



Badger Mountain Centennial Preserve is a Benton County park where you can enjoy sweeping vistas, hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding, bird watching and viewing our area's native plants and wildflowers. There are two trails in the park:

Canyon Trail (shown in green) is a 1.1-mile hiker-only trail to the summit of Badger Mountain. The trailhead is located off Queensgate Dr. To reach the trailhead, take I-182 to Queensgate South exit. Turn left on Keene, right on Shockley and drive to the end where it makes a left turn onto Queensgate Drive. Follow the brown trailhead signs for parking by the tan block building. A gravel path leads to the trailhead.

Skyline Trail (shown in red) is a 2.2-mile trail open to hikers, mountain bike riders and horseback riders. To reach the trailhead, from I-182 exit onto Queensgate North. Turn left on Duportail Street (at Wal-Mart). Turn right on Keene Road and take it to the round-about. Follow the round-about $\frac{3}{4}$ the way around to Bombing Range Road (becomes Dallas Road in a few blocks). Go about one mile uphill, under the I-182 overpass the crest. Turn left onto 210 PR NE, a gravel road with three branches. Go a few hundred yards on the middle road to the parking area on the right. The trailhead starts from the parking area.

Motorized vehicles are prohibited on Badger Mountain.
