### Badger Mountain Time Trial Event, Sunday, September 25, 12:00-3:00

Watch cyclists zoom along 4 miles of your favorite mountain trails, with best viewing places being the finish line at the West Summit, the top of the Canyon Trail, and the end of the Sagebrush Trail. **Impact on trails:** 

- Entire Skyline trail CLOSED from 11:00 AM to 2:00 PM, meaning "Trailhead Park Loop" is also closed.
- Canyon Trail is OPEN, as is the Sagebrush Trail (to the intersection with Skyline).
- All patrons should use CAUTION on the mountain and especially in the summit areas where there are a few blind spots (East Summit in particular, around the last corner).
- You can find further information at the <u>Benton County Web site</u> and at the <u>Chinook Cycling Club</u>, where you can also register to enter the ride.

# Come on Out for Launch of Fall Trail Work - Saturday, Oct. 15

From our Trailmaster, Jim Langdon -- Plans for fall trail work are to add rocks along the edge of the Sagebrush Trail and then top it with gravel. Also, to widen and do general maintenance on the Skyline Trail. There will be work parties every weekend as long as the weather allows, and there will be work going on mid-week, as well. On Saturday, October 15th we'll meet near the Trailhead Park restrooms at 9:00 AM. As always, bring work gloves, water, and snacks, and dress for the weather. We'll provide the tools. I'll send out emails announcing all the work parties. To be added to my list, send me an email. If you plan to join a work party, it helps that you sign up via e-mail so I can plan the work and have enough tools available.

The generous grant from REI will be used for various trail needs, to purchase a second gravel hauler, and to upgrade the drive mechanism on the Badger Tram. If you know something about hydraulic drives get a hold of me.
