Badger Mountain Challenge The 2nd Annual Badger Mountain Challenge was a resounding success, with 659 entrants (some of whom are shown in the photo at the top of this page). Several hundred were from out of town, coming from as far away as New York, Virginia, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Hawaii, across Canada, and Christ Church, New Zealand! The winner of the 100 mile endurance run was Shawna Tompkins, age 40, from Mt. Vernon, WA. Even though she got lost for over an hour, she came in at 21:34. The winner of the 50K was Justin Yates, age 29, from Missoula, who came in at 3:54. David Hurtado, age 29, from Richland, won the 15K, shaving three minutes off his last year's win, coming in at 1:6:01. In the 15 and 50 races, other runners were minutes behind, making for a lot of excitement.

The BMC attracted an age range of 9 to 79 years old, had twelve entrants from the local "Fun Fit and

Over Fifty Club", two soldiers from Ft. Lewis on their first 100 miler, and five from the Kennewick Fire Department, who tackled the 100 miles as a relay. Everyone who entered was proud and felt the excitement of being part of this seminal event -- the buzz is still being heard three weeks later! Rerouting of the Canyon Trail Another big Thank You! is due Trailmaster Jim and all those who worked with him almost every day for a month to reroute the Canyon Trail. If you hike the Canyon, you know we dropped the trail below the very rocky Windy Ridge to create an easier, smoother route that curves around the flank of the mountain. The Columbia Basin Chapter of the WA Native Plant Society has been revegetating the rocky area with plants removed in the reroute. Let us know what you think and, again, many thanks to all!

The Skyline Trail The water tank being installed near the Skyline Trail is just outside the boundaries of the Preserve. It's intended for the new Badger Mountain South development, which will be built on the south side of the mountain, between the orchard and the freeway. The development will set aside 30% of their land as open space, and build trails to connect to the mountain trails. FOBM has asked and the owners have committed to reducing the impact from the installation of the tank by restoring the ground with native vegetation. Look for the restoration work to begin in the next few weeks.
